

ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTIVE

Administrative Directive Title: Student Home Language Surveys	AD Number: 4.207.1	Adopted: November 2024
Policy References: Board Policy 4.207- English Language Learners	Revised:	

- 1 The school district is required to identify all English Learner (EL) students in need of language
- 2 assistance services within the first thirty (30) days of initial enrollment. The Home Language
- 3 Survey (HLS) is a questionnaire administered to parents/guardians at the time of enrollment that
- 4 aids the district in identifying potential EL students. The HLS shall include, but not be limited to,
- 5 questions that require the parent(s) or guardian(s) to address the following three (3) topics:
- 6 1. The first language the student learned to speak;
 - 2. The language the student speaks most often at home; and
 - 3. The language that is most often spoken to the student at home.
- 9 If the parent/guardian list a language other than English for any question above, the student will
- be classified as a Non-English Language Background (NELB) Student. Parents/guardians must be
- interviewed to clarify any discrepancies in the HLS. The school district will not inquire about
- immigration status on the HLS to avoid creating a barrier to enrollment.
- 13 The HLS will be provided to enrolling parents/guardians as a separate document in a language and
- manner that the parent can understand. If the student has previously attended another school
- district, the receiving school shall attempt to obtain the original HLS from the sending school. If
- the receiving school cannot obtain the original HLS after reasonable attempts to do so, it may re-
- administer the HLS, but must mark it as a secondary HLS. If the original is found, it shall replace
- the secondary HLS in the student's file.

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- 19 If an HLS is determined to contain errors after the initial administration, the school should re-
- 20 interview the parents or guardians. Any changes should be documented. All versions and
- documents related to changes should be retained in the student's file.
