1 The School Nursing Supervisor will be responsible for ensuring that all staff receive information on the

2 guidelines for addressing the care of students who are injured while at school. This information will be

3 distributed at least annually.

#### 4 IMMEDIATE RESPONSE

5 Upon witnessing or being informed of a student accident or injury, the staff member with the closest 6 proximity to the scene shall:

- Ensure the safety of the student and others by removing any immediate hazards (e.g., moving
  students away from dangerous areas).
- 9 2. Administer basic first aid if necessary, and if trained to do so.
- 10 3. Notify the school nurse or designated health staff immediately for further assessment and care.
- If the injury is severe or life-threatening, call 911 or emergency medical services (EMS)
  immediately.

13 If the injury occurs in a classroom or during a school activity, the staff member will ensure that the

remaining students are supervised and safe while attending to the injured student. Another staff member may be assigned to monitor the other students or the activity while the injured student is being cared for.

#### 16 School Nurse Responsibilities

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- 17 1. The school nurse will assess the student's injury upon arrival at the scene or in the health office.
- 18 2. Based on the assessment, the following actions will be taken:
  - a. Administer appropriate medical care according to the injury and the student's health plan (if applicable).
- 21b. Decide if the student requires further medical attention or if the injury can be managed at22school.
- c. If necessary, contact the student's parent/guardian to discuss next steps (e.g., picking the
  student up or seeking medical care).

## 25 **RETURNING TO SCHOOL**

- 26 For certain injuries (e.g., concussions, fractures), the school may implement temporary accommodations
- or modifications to the student's school activities based on medical recommendations.

## 28 EMERGENCY SITUATIONS

- 29 For serious or life-threatening injuries (e.g., severe bleeding, head trauma, unconsciousness):
- 30 1. Call 911 or emergency medical services (EMS) immediately.
- 31 2. Notify the parent/guardian as soon as possible.

32 3. Ensure that a staff member remains with the student until emergency personnel arrive.

33 In the event that a student requires transport to the hospital and a parent/guardian is not present, a

34 designated school administrator or designee shall accompany the student to the hospital. The

35 administrator/designee will stay with the student until the parent, guardian, or emergency contact arrives.

#### **36 DOCUMENTATION**

- 37 The school nurse will document the injury using a Student Accident Report in compliance with the
- 38 requirements of Board Policy 6.416.
