Voluntary, Title I, and Local Programs

Children who are four (4) years of age by August 15th and live within the city limits of Murfreesboro are selected for *the Voluntary Pre-K* program if they meet the eligibility requirements of school age children qualifying for low income or other risk factors designated on the state's eligibility form.

Qualifications for a Title I preschool program:

- *The child has taken the preschool screening instrument.
- *Children who have a below-average score will be placed in Title I classrooms
- *Admission to Title I classrooms is based on assessment scores alone

Basis of Preschool Assignments and Admission Requirements

Children living in federal housing developments will be given priority to a pre-K program existing in the housing development. (Mercury Court and Oakland Court) All other preschool classes are limited to children residing in the zones of Murfreesboro City Schools. Proof of address is required.

The preschool child must be 4 years of age on or before August 15th.*

*Does not apply to children requiring Special Education services.

A student entering the preschool program for the first time (including those transferring from other systems) must present to the school principal:

(a) A birth certificate (mother's copy is acceptable) or officially acceptable evidence of date of birth at the time of registration;

(b) Evidence of a current medical examination. There shall be a complete medical

(e) Verification of Address The name used on the records of a student entering school must be that as shown on the birth certificate unless evidence is presented that such name has been legally changed through a court as prescribed by law. If the parent does not have or cannot obtain a birth certificate, then the name used on the records of such student will be that as shown on documents which are acceptable to the school principal as proof of date of birth. 6. A child whose residence changes to another school zone after the first school month will not be required to change schools for the balance of the school year as long as the following requirements are met: The student's initial enrollment was bona fide; • Guardian is able to provide transportation to and from school in such a manner that prevents tardiness and absences; • Student follows all rules/regulations of the school. Any in-school or out-of-school suspensions may result in the child's transfer to his/her zoned school; • In subsequent years, students moving out of the city limits will be required to complete an out-of-city application for enrollment into Murfreesboro City Schools. Students moving out of the county will be required to pay tuition as determined by the School Board that is pro-rated for the remainder of the year. In subsequent years, the student must complete an out-of-city application for enrollment into Murfreesboro City Schools. Students moving to another city school zone must complete a zone waiver for the remainder of the present year. • Enrollment in subsequent years is subject to space availability and completion of appropriate zone waivers/out-of-city applications. 7. A child's residence for enrollment purposes shall be defined as the address of his/her legal guardian or parent. A child's legal residence shall not be the address of an aunt, grandparent, babysitter, etc., unless that person has been appointed as the child's legal guardian.
