The Primary Care & Hope Clinic provides healthcare for all ages.

Services provided by the clinic include:

- Annual physicals
- Adult and child immunizations
- Women's Health services
- Behavioral Health services
- Healthcare for chronic illnesses such as diabetes, hypertension and high cholesterol
- Health care for minor injuries including cuts, burn and suture removal
- Translation services are available.

### --Pediatric Services

The Primary Care & Hope Clinic is committed to providing affordable, accessible healthcare for children. Staff specially trained in pediatric care provide:

- Well child check-ups/ annual physicals
- Immunizations
- Health care for acute illnesses such as colds, flu and sore throats
- Health care for minor injuries including cuts, burn and suture removal

### --Women's Health Services

- Annual Exams
- Physicals
- Birth control
- Pap Tests
- Mammogram Referrals

### --Behavioral Health Services

The Primary Care & Hope Clinic uses an integrated behavioral health model that teams a counselor with your medical provider. Private, in-house behavioral health counseling for adults, adolescents, and children is available with our licensed counselors.

The Primary Care & Hope Clinic has on-site X-ray.

### --Lab Services

The Primary Care & Hope Clinic has an on-site lab that provides testing for blood work, urinalysis, Hemoglobin, STD screening and PAP smears.

#### **Services Include:**

##### **Breastfeeding Promotion:**

--Education, encouragement and support are offered to pregnant and postpartum women by a full time lactation consultant.

##### **Children's Special Services (CSS):**

--Medical services are coordinated by a full time social worker for children (birth to 21 years) with special handicapping or chronic conditions who meet financial criteria.

##### **Child Health**

--Well baby/child exams, immunizations, and/or sick care are provided to children 20 years and younger.

##### **Dental Services**

--Preventive and restorative dental care is provided to children 20 years and younger by a full-time dentist and dental assistant.

##### **Diabetic Education**

--Education and counseling are available to both diabetics and those at high risk for the disease by a team composed of a registered nurse, registered dietitian, and health educator

##### **Emergency Preparedness**

--Volunteers are recruited and trained to operate emergency clinics in order to administer medications or immunizations to large numbers of people very quickly. --

##### **Epidemiology**

--Communicable disease and food borne illnesses are investigated, specimens are collected, lab testing is conducted and preventive treatment is provided as appropriate.

##### **Family Planning**

--Education, counseling, physical exam and birth control are provided.

##### **Food and General Sanitation**

--Environmental specialists inspect existing food service establishments and review plans for prospective ones. Inspections are also done on hotels, motels, public swimming pools, bed and breakfasts, childcare facilities and school plants.

##### **Health Education/Promotion**

--Health educators coordinate activities that focus attention on lifestyle choices that will result in positive differences for at-risk groups.

##### **Immunizations**

--Routine immunizations are provided to infants, children and adults.

##### **Men's Health**

--Routine preventive care, sick care and physicals are provided to uninsured men, ages 21 years and older.

##### **Paternity Acknowledgement**

--Information is provided to parents regarding paternity and paperwork is completed for those parents wishing to acknowledge paternity.

### **Prenatal Care**

--Pregnancy testing, options counseling, prenatal vitamins and temporary enrollment on TennCare are available.

### **Sexually Transmitted Diseases**

--Confidential testing, treatment and contact follow-up is provided for sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV/AIDS.

### **Tuberculosis**

--Skin testing is provided to persons assessed to be at risk for tuberculosis. -- Medication is provided at no cost to suspected, active and latent cases. Contacts to suspected or known cases are notified, tested and treated as needed.

- Must be able to pass a drug test.
- Cannot be a sex offender or on the registry.

*A Friend of Bill's, LLC* has the capacity to house 58 resident clients. We have one recovery home in Hendersonville, Tennessee, two recovery homes in Lebanon, Tennessee, one house in Murfreesboro, TN, and our newest home in Henderson, KY. All of our homes are located in attractive residential areas within walking distance of various industries and businesses. There are many churches in all locations that sponsor AA/NA meetings and related recovery events. We provide bikes for our clients to use when walking is not a practical option.

There is a house manager and one or more house monitors in each of our recovery homes. It is the house manager's job to assign chores and to verify that the rules of conduct are being followed. The house monitors help our newer residents in their adjustment as they settle in and also help the house manager as needed.

We believe that it is insane to expect an alcoholic or addict to amend the alcohol or drug driven behavior without the benefit of a spiritual awakening therefore, each resident signs a recovery contract that includes working the 12 steps of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) or Narcotics Anonymous (NA) with a sponsor.

### **Our Services**

When clients first move into the recovery house, they are directed to agencies that can provide emergency food supplies and are encouraged to sign up for state food stamp programs. This helps until they can gain employment and get on their feet. We also direct clients to the temporary employment agencies where they can usually obtain initial employment.



At *A Friend of Bill's*, we are very active with our recovery houses. Staff members attend the house meetings which are held two times a week. We visit the houses every other day to provide assistance, answer questions, solve problems and attend to those issues which require our input. We also offer rides to meetings when someone from the staff is attending, but we do encourage the clients to build a support group and get phone numbers of other AA and NA participants who are usually eager to help. We also have house managers and monitors with six months to a year of sobriety that live on premises and aid our new clients whenever possible.

Every client participates in our recovery process, "Working The 12 Step Program", because they choose to. It is a great experience living with a group of men who are working hard to practice recovery.

### **The Costs Involved**

The initial cost to move into *Friend of Bill's* recovery houses in TN is normally \$285. This includes first week's service fees of \$125.00 and last week of client commitment of \$125 and a one time processing fee of \$35. After that client will pay \$125 weekly. The initial cost to move into *Friend of Bill's* recovery houses in KY and the women's recovery home in Lebanon, Tn is normally \$235. This includes first weeks service fees of \$100 and the last week of client commitment and a one time processing fee of \$35. After that clients pay \$100 weekly. Once a month there is a \$10.00 charge for cleaning supplies and other miscellaneous expenses.

### **Court Ordered Clients**

Some of the clients at *A Friend of Bill's* are placed with us through the court system and arrive under a condition of house arrest. We would like to assure area courts, judges and probation officers that these clients are closely monitored. The following special policies apply to such clients:

1. All clients under restriction are required to document their time away from the house. They must sign out, indicating the date, time and purpose for leaving. When they return, they must sign back in. We have special forms for this purpose.
2. Restricted clients are required to attend daily AA or NA meetings. We have meeting forms that must be signed by the chairperson indicating meeting time, date, group name and subject. As we are heavily involved with all of the local recovery organizations, we can easily verify that meetings were actually attended.
3. If requested, we will perform random drug testing on restricted clients if the testing kits are provided by the court. Alternatively, we can perform occasional tests at a charge of \$15.00 per test.
4. We have a employment verification form that must be completed by the restricted clients once they have obtained a job. Information on this form includes place of employment, phone number, supervisor's name and extension and normal work hours. This information is an additional tool for tracking clients daily activities and a means for quickly contacting them in case of emergency.

Each of our houses has one or two managers and also house monitors that work with the clients to ensure rules are being followed and required documentation is being completed.

## **IV- The Foundation: Sober Living for Women**

### **Admission Requirements:**

- Female and 18 years of age or older
- Admission is on a voluntary basis. Residents in need of detoxification will need to go to a treatment facility prior to admission, as we are not equipped as a detox center.
- Residents are accepted by referral from a chemical dependency professional, an AA/NA sponsor who has witnessed the person's participation in 12 step support groups for at least 30 days, or have completed an inpatient/outpatient chemical dependency program.
- Must be able to pay room and board. First week's rent of \$125.00 and a \$100.00 application fee are due before arrival.
- Residents must commit to follow the house rules and regulations.
- Residents must participate in a 12 step AA/NA program.
- Ambulatory: Residents must be able to manage stairs and move about under their own locomotion. The FOUNDation is not wheelchair accessible nor do we have medical staff on site.
- Psychologically Capable: In addition to alcohol and drug addictions, some suffer from severe mental disorders requiring psychiatric treatment. These conditions can not be treated in our program.
- Residents will be screened by the Director and House Managers.
- Residents may be subject to a full physical examination that may be provided free at the health department. As we are not qualified to deal with certain medical problems at this facility.
- Our program does not accept sex offenders, violent offenders, arsonists, murderers, or mental health offenders. Also, applicants who are TB, Hepatitis, and HIV positive will not be accepted.
- Applicants must be willing to commit to at least a 6 month program.

### **Fees and Charges:**

- Housing cost is \$125.00 a week.
- One time application fee of \$100.00.
- Utilities are \$100 a month and are due by the 15th of each month.
- There is a \$25.00 fee for drug and alcohol testing.
- There is a \$5.00 per day late fee for rent and utilities not paid on due date. After the fifth day of late charges, you will have 24 hours to pay in full or vacate the premises.
- If you leave our program for ANY reason you will NOT receive a refund.

**\*\*Once you have read and understood the requirements, the next step in beginning living sober at the FOUNDation is filling out an application. We look forward to receiving your submission. - Case Management Program

**Emissions Testing**

-Take your vehicle to one of the official vehicle emissions inspection stations, and bring your title and/or vehicle registration documentation. You can have your vehicle tested at any testing station regardless of where your vehicle is registered.

-Effective, July 1, 2014 the emissions test changed to \$9.00. No bills larger than \$20 accepted.

-Once your vehicle has satisfied the test requirements, you can renew your registration online or in person. You can mail or take your renewal form, your emissions compliance certificate, and the proper fees to the Office of the Rutherford County Clerk.

-Emissions tests are valid for 90 days.

**Safety Considerations – Your vehicle may not be tested if:**

-It has fuel, oil, or coolant leaks

-It has visible smoke It has excessive exhaust leaks

-The idle is not set to factory specifications

-It doesn't have catalytic converter(s)

-The inspector would have to reach more than elbow's length under the vehicle to insert the sampling probe.

**Helpful Tip:** Always have the vehicle's engine warmed to operating condition prior to testing  
To avoid potential long wait times, avoid testing at the end of the month and on Tuesdays.

**New Testing Requirements:**

-Beginning April 1, 2005, two new classes of motor vehicles must pass an emissions test before they can be registered in Davidson, Rutherford, Sumner, Williamson or Wilson Counties. The vehicles subject to testing are:

-Gasoline-powered vehicles 1975 and newer with a gross vehicle weight 10,500 pounds or less; previous limit was 8500 pounds; weight information is located on the vehicle's door jam.

-Diesel-powered vehicles 1975 and newer with a gross vehicle weight 10,500 pounds or less; diesel vehicles were not previously inspected.

-While the majority of diesel and gasoline powered vehicles will be subject to testing, electric cars, motorcycles and antiques are among a limited group of exempt vehicles. For more information, please call (615) 399-8995 or visit the web site.
