## MCS ILLNESS GUIDE

Students sent to the school nurse with symptoms of illness may be asked to put on a mask and assessed for communicable diseases and may be excluded according to policy 6.403 until written documentation is provided from a healthcare provider or the health department that they are safe to return.

Symptom/Illness	Should <u>NOT</u> attend school	MAY attend school
Fever	□ Fever (>100°F)	☐ Fever resolved without the use of a fever reducing medication (Advil or Tylenol) for <b>24 hours</b>
Cough	☐ Frequent, disruptive, uncontrollable cough	☐ When non-disruptive to the classroom setting
Sore Throat	☐ Sore throat, swollen lymph nodes, headache, nausea, and/or with fever (>100°F) ☐ Positive Strep test or symptoms of Strep Throat	<ul> <li>□ After 24 hours on antibiotics <u>OR</u></li> <li>□ Negative throat culture <u>OR</u></li> <li>□ Resolving symptoms</li> </ul>
Diarrhea or Vomiting	☐ Diarrhea (2 or more episodes) OR☐ Vomiting (1 episode)	☐ If free from diarrhea/vomiting without the use of medication for <b>24 hours</b>
Pediculosis (Head Lice)  *Exposure notification will be sent home for multiple cases in the same grade level.	☐ Live lice are present	☐ With proof of treatment <u>OR</u> ☐ School nurse confirming lice-free before returning to class
Rash or Skin Infection	☐ Illness based rash or signs of skin infection that is undiagnosed by a medical provider	<ul><li>☐ When rash is improving <u>OR</u></li><li>☐ Written release from a medical provider</li></ul>
Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye)	☐ Eye appears to be infected ☐ Eyelashes are matted ☐ Think drainage is present	<ul> <li>□ Written documentation from a medical provider with return to school information AND/OR</li> <li>□ After 24 hours of eye treatment</li> <li>□ Non-infectious eye irritation (allergies, etc.)</li> </ul>
*Exposure notification will be sent home for multiple concurrent cases in the same class.	□ Positive COVID-19 result, regardless of vaccination status should stay home and isolate from others for a minimum of <b>5 days</b> from the onset of symptoms □ Symptoms can be one or more of the following; cough, loss of taste or smell, fever, chills, congestion, sore throat, headache, fatigue, vomiting and/or	☐ After <b>5 days</b> from the onset of symptoms (Day 0) and improving symptoms or medical provider note indicating a date for return to school <u>AND</u> fever free for <b>24 hours</b> without the use of medication

Flu	☐ Positive Flu test or doctors' diagnosis of Flu ☐ Fever (>100°F)	☐ Improving symptoms or medical provider note indicating a date for return to school <u>AND</u> fever free for <b>24 hours</b> without the use of medication
Hand Foot and Mouth  *Exposure notification will be	☐ Positive for HFM☐ Fever (>100°F), blisters/sores on hand, feet, or mouth area.	□ Written release from a medical provider AND  Fever resolved without the use of a fever
