The DLM Alternate Assessment System provides accessibility by design and is guided by the core beliefs that all students are to have access to challenging grade-level content, and test administrators must adhere to the highest levels of integrity when providing instruction and administering assessments based on this challenging content. TCAP-ALT Science and Social Studies	Grades 3-6	TCAP Alternate (TCAP-Alt) are assessments in science and social studies designed for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities in grades 3–8 and grade 10 and measure student mastery of the Tennessee Academic Standards. While the TCAP-Alt covers grade-level standards at a simplified level, it also includes many built-in supports, modified materials, and accommodations. The TCAP-Alt was developed by Tennessee educators who ensured the assessment questions were aligned to standards <i>and</i> accessible to students with the most significant disabilities. 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ELPA 21 Screener	Grades K-6	The Home Language Survey consists of three (3) questions that will be asked of every parent or guardian enrolling his/her child in the school district. These questions are:  1. What is the first language this child learned to speak?  2. What language does this child speak most often outside of school?  3. What language do people usually speak in this child's home? If a parent answer yes to any of the above questions, their child must be screened. ELPA 21 Screener is an English language proficiency assessment given to new students in Grades K–12 to help educators identify whether they are English language learners (ELLs).	Student enrolled in the school/district prior to the beginning of the school year must be screened within 30 days after the beginning of the school year. Student enrolled in the school/district during the school year must be screened within 14 calendar days. Parental permission for language proficiency testing is not required. Parental permission to provide ESL	Notification of ESL services must be sent to parents on an annual basis. All notifications sent to parents must be in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language that the parents can understand.

iReady Math (used to meet RTI requirements)	Grades K-6	i-Ready Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment designed to provide teachers with actionable insight into student needs. It offers a complete picture of student performance and growth, eliminating the need for multiple, redundant tests. By adapting to student responses and assessing a broad range of skills—including skills above and below a student's chronological grade—the i-Ready Diagnostic pinpoints student ability level, identifies the specific skills students need to learn to accelerate their growth, and charts a personalized learning path for each student. 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AIMSWeb (used to meet RTI requirements) English Language Arts	Grades K-6	Aimsweb®Plus screens and monitors the reading and math skills of PreK–12 students. With its robust set of standards-aligned measures, Aimsweb®Plus is proven to uncover learning gaps quickly, identify at-risk students, and assess individual and classroom growth. AIMs will be used to determine needed interventions, track progress, and increase student opportunities to meet annual achievement requirements. Only students scoring at the 25th percentile and below will be administered the AIMs diagnostic assessment to determine intervention for math (i.e., students scoring at the 25th percentile or below on the math iReady). AIMs, diagnostic assessment, will be used to determine the intervention needed and at what grade-level the intervention will be implemented. Intervention progress reports are sent home with students every 4.5 weeks to inform parents of their child's progress within the interventions class.

The Benchmark Assessments include a battery of assessments which include: letter recognition, letter-sound identification, phonological awareness, spelling, decoding and fluency. When administering the Benchmark Assessments, it is important to administer the priority assessments which include: letter name and sound identification, spelling, and decoding as these assessments are the assessments that work in combination with the Assessment Conversion chart to help teachers place students in the appropriate instructional cycle.
